
How-to Guide for submitting games on Tabletop. Events for 1d4Con 2019

This guide is meant to be a resource to anyone who wants to submit a game for 1d4Con 2019.

1) Go to http://tabletop.events and click *Login* to create a free site account.




2) Fill out the information on the right side of the screen and then click *Create Account* to submit.




- 1) Or connect using Facebook
 - 1) You can optionally link the accounts in the Account Settings page.


3) Once your account is created, go to our Event Page: http://tabletop.events/conventions/1d4con-2019 or search for it in their convention list.




4) There you will see the event home page a long with options on the right-hand side. Click the "*Submit Events*" button:



1) Alternately, you can click on the "Host" menu, located under the Convention Banner in the top left of the screen, and select the *Select Events* option.



5) On the new page, click the "New Submission" button to get started:




6) Next, you'll have to select your Event Type:



1) Event Types

- 1) Board Games
- 2) Card Games
- 3) Charity Games These are games that cost an extra fee to participate in. 100% proceeds go to charity
- 4) D&D Adventurers League Should only be used by Staff or DDAL PoC to designate games.
- 5) D&D Adventurers League Charity Games As above, costs an extra fee to participate in.
- 6) LARP Live Action Role-playing games
- 7) Miniatures Games
- 8) Pathfinder Society Should only be used by Staff or PFS PoC to designate games.
- 9) Pathfinder Society Charity Games As above, costs an extra fee to participate in.
- 10) Rogue Cthulhu Should only be used by Staff or Rogue Cthulhu members to designate games.
- 11) Tabletop RPG

7) Now you'll open a new page with all of the submission dialog questions to answer about your scenario:



- 1) *Event Type* Will be pre-filled, but you can change it here if you need to.
- 2) **Event Name** The title of your game/scenario.
- 3) **Short Description** Give the audience an idea of what your game is about without spoilers. *We've changed the default to 1500 characters.*
 - 1) Optional Longer description. If you need more than 1500.
- 4) *More Information URL* Use this to link to your Organized Play group, LARP site, Game Publisher, or anything that is informative about your game.
- 5) **Preferred Start Time** What **Day and Time slot** you would like your game to be hosted at.
- 6) **Alternate Start Time** What **Day and Time slot** you would like to host your game if the preferred slot is unavailable.
 - 1) Remember that we are going back to a Block/slot schedule this year so the only selectable times are:

Friday (May 3rd):

Slot 1: 2pm to 6pm

Slot 2: 7:30pm to 11:30pm

Saturday (May 4th):

Slot 3: 9am to 1pm

Slot 4: 2pm to 6pm

Slot 5: 7:30pm to 11:30pm

Sunday (May 5th):

Slot 6: 10am to 2pm

- 2) Please note that certain events may go outside of this like board games, LARPs, etc, but that will only be with Staff permission.
- 7) **Duration** How long is your game supposed to run. *Defaults are 2 and 4 hours, but different events may require more or less time.*
- 8) *Max Tickets* What is the maximum amount of players you would like to have before others are wait listed. For instance, if you want 4 players, you would set this to 4 tickets.
- 9) *Age Range* What is the ideal age group appropriate for the content in your game.
- 10) What genre/theme best describes your game? This allows potential players to get an idea of the theme or maybe even tone of your game.
- 11) What Game System are you using (include edition\version number)? This tells the player what rules system to expect. Be as specific as possible: D&D 5th Edition, Call of Cthulhu 7th Edition, D&D Basic Set (Moldvey Ruleset), etc.
- 12) **Who is this game intended for?** Are you looking for Beginners or for Veterans?
- 13) *If you are participating in our Games of Charity, what Boons are available for ticket holders?* (Completely Optional even if designated as a Charity game) List the boons that players can gain by spending "*Games of Charity*" tickets sold at the Registration Table.
 - 1) Participation in Games of Charity is completely optional by the GM. It is a way for players to gain benefits (aka boons) in participating games and give to Charity by purchasing designated tickets from the Registration Table.
- 14) *Are Pregen characters provided?* Tell potential players whether you will provide characters, have them build characters at the table, or require that they bring characters.
- 15) *Event Submission Rules* This is the default in the Event Management system, you must agree to the these rules in order to submit your game.

- 8) Once a game is submitted, you may go back into it and make some changes if necessary.
- 9) The game is then either Approved, has a Change Request attached, or Declined by the Staff.
 - 1) Approved means the game is ready to be assigned to a table or area of play.
 - 2) Change Request means that there is an issue with the submission, such as start time and duration don't fit into the designated gaming time.
 - 3) Declined means that there is something very wrong with the submission or it does not fit into the event schedule.
